The plan outlined the replacement of vehicles for Code Compliance (1), Building Inspectors (2), Streets (2), Parks and Recreation (1), Water (4), and Wastewater (2). This is a request to purchase three (3) 2022 Ford F-250 4x4 Trucks, seven (7) 2022 Ford F-150 4x2 Trucks, and one (1) Ford F-350 Dump Body and Tarp Truck, one (1) Ford F-350 Crane Truck from Rush Truck Centers, through an interlocal agreement with Buyboard. Each vehicle will be outfitted with decals from Signs & D'signs; and light bars from GT Distributors.

Computers are purchased through CDW-G, LLC through state contract DIR-TSO-4025 (Texas Department of Information Resources). Accessories are through Priority Public Safety-LLC whom service and outfit all our law enforcement vehicles.

Agenda Caption:

Discuss and consider a resolution authorizing the assignment and assumption of an Economic Development Agreement between the City of Lancaster and RW Dallas Midpoint I Owner, LLC to Scout Cold Storage Lancaster, LP.

Background:

On February 22, 2021, the City Council approved an Economic Development Agreement with RW Dallas Midpoint I Owner, LLC (Dallas Midpoint) to provide an annual grant in an amount equivalent to forty-five percent (45%) of real property taxes assessed against the property for a given tax year for a period of five (5) years. The grant was a contributing factor for Dallas Midpoint to undertake the project and build a 549,017 square foot warehouse-distribution building. The building is complete except for the tenant finish out.

Scout Cold Storage Lancaster, LP (Scout) is under contract to purchase the building and complete finish out by December 31, 2022. Dallas Midpoint requested the Economic Development Agreement be assigned from Dallas Midpoint to Scout.

Per Section 10(c) in the Agreement, Dallas Midpoint may not assign the Agreement to a non-subsidiary without the City's prior written consent.

Operational Considerations:

Upon assignment of the agreement, Scout Cold Storage Lancaster, LP. will annually submit detailed verification of the real property tax report and receipts for tax payments in order to exercise the grant. Within 60 days of payment verification, the City will remit forty-five percent (45%) of the payment to the company for a period of five (5) years.

- 1. <u>Location and Size:</u> The property is located at the southeast corner of Henry Road and Bruce Drive and is approximately 0.182 acre in size.
- 2. **Current Zoning:** The subject property is currently zoned Single-Family Residential (SF-6).

accessed from the front street, must be located at least 20 feet behind closest corner of the front building façade for front entry garages, unless it is a "J-Swing" garage where the garage door is perpendicular to the street". The applicant is requesting to allow a front-loaded garage that protrudes approximately six feet forward from the front facade of a single-family dwelling.

The applicant subdivided one lot into two with the intent of constructing two single-family dwellings. It should be noted the original lot configuration could have met the garage location requirement. The protruding front loaded garage does not enhance the building design and is not compatible with the intended character.
